

2024 Student Resource Scheme (SRS)

Purpose

In accordance with the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, the cost of providing instruction, administration and facilities for the education of students enrolled at State schools who are Australian citizens or permanent residents, or children of Australian citizens or permanent residents, is met by the State. Cost of consumables i.e. booklists and resource schemes are to be met by the parent/carer.

Benefits of the Scheme

- Students have the required resources for their education when they commence school.
- Savings that the school can secure through bulk purchases and discounts are passed on to families.
- The scheme saves parents/carers time and money in sourcing appropriate textbooks, stationery resources, enrichment resources and other materials supplied under the scheme.

How do I participate?

Parents are required to complete the SRS Participation Agreement Form when joining the scheme for the first time by ticking YES and returning the form to the office. The participation agreement form allows parents to participate in the SRS for the **whole of their child's enrolment at the school**. Parents only need to complete a new participation agreement form if they changed their mind about participating in the SRS in any year. Your child will be issued with the resources through their classroom once payment has been received.

What if I do not want to be part of the Resource Scheme or pay the fee?

Should you choose not to participate in the SRS, you are required to complete the SRS Participation Agreement Form, by ticking NO and return this form to the School Office. You will be required to pay a fee for any school produced items, all text books provided and associated items included in the SRS listed in this document.

Payment Options

Payment can be made by credit card, BPoint or cash. Payment plans can be arranged via Centrelink or through negotiation with the school office.

Paying by Centrelink:

Centrepay deductions are available to pay the SRS charges. Use Centrepay to make regular deductions from your Centrelink payment. Centrepay is a voluntary and easy payment option available to Centrelink customers.
